More age group medals came in the boys' 200m breaststroke with a silver apiece for Dixon (11/12) and Winnicott (15+) while Luke Davies took third spot in the 13/14 category.

Breaststroke success continued in the girls' 100m event where Sneekes and Gina Luckett won gold and silver respectively for the club in the 11/13age group.

The duo made the Championship final along with Emily Gordon and Jenny Fowler who were third and fifth in the 15+. Sneekes edged Gordon in the final where they

won silver and bronze. In the 50m fly, Dixon (11/12) won another gold and Josh Holsey a silver while Wilson claimed bronze in the 13/14.

In the 15+ Phil Hewitt, Chris Littler and Kelly all qualified for the final where the latter set a new personal best and club record to take bronze.

In the two 11-16yrs relay events, the girls took gold in the 4x50m Medley in a club record while the boys claimed silver in the 4x50m freestyle.
