The first success was led by Cunningham and Price in the 10-year 200m freestyle relay, swimming strong first and second legs respectively as Warwickshire recorded their first win of the day.

Cunningham also swam just outside his personal best (PB) in the 50m backstroke, while Price swam an impressive 50m butterfly to claim first place in a PB and a new club record time of 34.36secs.

Luckett claimed points for Warwickshire in the aged 12 200m freestyle and medley re-lays, plus the 100m breast-

In the aged 12 boys' freestyle and medley relays, Wilson swam two storming last legs to ensure first in both events.

He then capped his day's performance with a win in the individual 100m freestyle, smashing his PB by more than two seconds in 1.03.39mins.

Sneekes raced in the 13-year 200m freestyle and medley re-lays and claimed third in the 100m freestyle.
